

Wales for Peace – Volunteering Opportunities

Volunteer Facilitators

Description of role: We are looking for volunteers who can help us to facilitate workshops, events and training to support schools and community groups in learning about, exploring and sharing aspects of Wales' peace heritage.

Time Commitment: This is a flexible opportunity. Dates for workshops and events are set in advance, and volunteers will be able to choose dates on which they are available. Some travelling will be involved.

What you will do: This role includes working with the Wales for Peace Learning Coordinator to prepare input to school / community groups, and to deliver this input as part of ongoing projects. Sessions tend to include some information sharing, but also interactive exercises and the facilitation of group exercises and discussion. All input is evaluated in terms of enjoyment, learning and skills.

Who would this role suit? This role would suit people with experience of teaching, or students of education, also people with experience of group facilitation. It will also suit people with an interest in one of the following: Wales' role in internationalism and peace, the history of Wales in the 20th Century.

Some of the benefits: Support will be available in the form of guidance from the Learning Coordinator and materials. Through this role volunteers will have the opportunity to develop facilitation skills, and to learn to develop and adapt delivery to meet the needs of particular audiences.
